## **Key LIS Databases – Which One Should You Use?**

## Comparing Library Lit Full Text/Retrospective, LISA, and LISTA

All of these are available to SLIS students. Which is better? It depends. The coverage of these online indexes overlaps, but isn't identical. Their search interfaces, although different in appearance, offer standard options for formulating basic and complex searches, combining search terms, displaying results, and saving, printing and emailing results.
