Each girl in the Simmons College community has the right to decide upon her own standard of dress. Along with this right comes a <sup>personal</sup> responsibility for the student to appear neatly attired at all times, and to encourage her fellow students to do the same.

However, for reasons of health, and because there are frequent guests on our campus, Student Government has formulated the following restrictions:

1. Rollers and pincurls ~~may be worn in Bartol Hall~~ <sup>cannot be worn outside the dorm except</sup> ~~only at~~ <sup>to</sup> breakfast. <sup>in Bartol Hall.</sup>
2. Shoes must be worn to meals in Bartol Hall.
3. Sunbathing attire may be worn only on the Evans Hall roof.

Because Sunday dinner is a time when students have traditionally entertained parents and guests at Bartol Hall, girls are strongly encouraged to dress appropriately for this meal. Male guests are also requested to respect this tradition.
