Dear Madam:

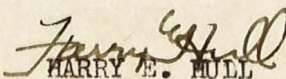
In accordance with its agreement with the Government Simmons College advises the Bureau that you are enrolled there for a full course of study under the name of Miss Anne S. A. Lauder-Brunton.
