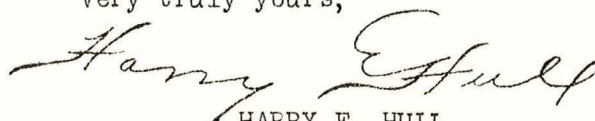
Dear Madam:

The records of the Bureau show the above named aliens have been admitted to the United States for the purpose of attending your school.

When your school applied for approval as an institution of learning for immigrant students under the Immigration Act of 1924, it agreed, immediately upon admission of an immigrant student to that school, to file with the Commissioner General of Immigration, Washington, a report in writing stating the name, age and local address of such student, the name and complete address of a friend or relative of such student in the United States, the date when he was admitted and the course of study to be pursued by him. An agreement was also made to report to the Secretary of Labor, in writing if such student terminated his attendance at the school, stating the date when and the reasons why such attendance was terminated. The Bureau would also like to have any information you may have on file concerning the alien's whereabouts and, if he has left the country, to know the date, ship and port of his departure in order that the records in his case may be closed.

The Bureau will be glad to be informed whether these aliens reported at your school and if they did, to receive the required information concerning them.
